



- April 24 A Sharp-shinned Hawk, two Brown Creepers and a Towhee were among 17 species found on a field trip to Glen Oak Park and Springdale Cemetary. Louise Endres led 10 people on this early evening outing.

- May 22 41 species of birds were counted by a group of five at Wildlife Frairie Fark led by Marj Bjorklund. The Orchard Oriole and Scarlet Tanager were seen.
- May 29 31 species were recorded by 6 people led by Mahlon Mahoney on an field trip at Jubilee College State Park. Yelbreasted Chat, Blue-winged Warbler, Yellow Warbler and White-eyed Vireo were found.
