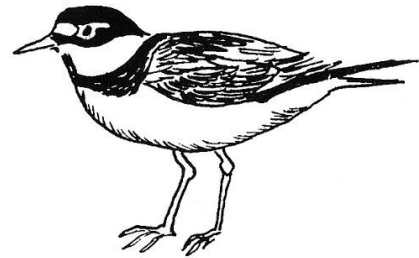

# FIELD NOTES

April 24 - A Sharp-shinned Hawk, two Brown Creepers and a Towhee were among 17 species found on a field trip to Glen Oak Park and Springdale Cemetary. Louise Endres led 10 people on this early evening outing.

April 28 - Seven Willets were seen by Maury Brucker 2 mi. S. of Camp Grove Stark Co.



May 22 - 41 species of birds were counted by a group of five at Wildlife Prairie Park led by Marj Bjorklund. The Orchard Oriole and Scarlet Tanager were seen.

May 29 - 31 species were recorded by 6 people led by Mahlon Mahoney on an field trip at Jubilee College State Park. Yellow-breasted Chat, Blue-winged Warbler, Yellow Warbler and White-eyed Vireo were found.
