NOTE FROM THE (PAST) PRESIDENT: Maury Brucker

Peoria Audubon has accomplished many things in the 52 years it has been organized. Right now, we are doing many activities - speaker programs, field trips, school education programs, conservation lobbying. Christmas counts, spring counts, newsletters, volunteer field research, bird seed sales, Peoria Eagle Days, and being representatives on Peoria Academy of Science. Illinois Audubon Council, and Heartland WRC. In July, the Peoria Audubon Board decided to reevaluate our goals and activities with a trained facilitator and would like to involve as many members as possible at one of our future meetings. AUDUBON ACTIVIST:

The Great Lakes Water Quality Initiative, drafted by the Environmental Protection Agency is under public review. It would reduce the industrial discharge of highly toxic chemicals such as lead, mercury, and PCB's. "This initiative recognizes the Great Lakes are one eco-system", says Stephen Sedam, Vice-President of Audubon's Great Lakes region. The plan would for the first time require eight states that border the Great Lakes (IL, IN, MI, MN, NY, OH, PA, and WI) to adopt uniform standards for the discharge of toxic pollutants.

Recycled Paper

Chemical contamination threatens the bounty of the ecologically rich lakes, which support rich fisheries, and abundant wildlife such as migratory waterfowl, bald eagles, and mink, and supply drinking water to more than 23 million people.

The EPA will take public comments until September 15 and will then issue final regulations. The states will have two years to adopt legislation. State and federal agencies will enforce the new standards. Write to:
