Conservation Report... by Les Bodell



But the Audubon Council of Illinois meeting the following day at Ryerson Forest Preserve made up for it. We received numerous updates and reports on pending legislation including reauthorization of the Clean Water Act. By the way, October is the 25th anniversary of this all important piece of legislation.

Steve Sedam gave a report on the upcoming Great Lakes Regional Conference to be held on Friday, November 7 through

Sunday, November 9 at Michigan City, Indiana. While there, we can expect to see up to 20,000 Sandhill Cranes at nearby Jasper-Pulaski State Wildlife Area. There will be numerous seminars and field trips led by expert birders.

Species Spotlight... The Red-bellied Woodpecker by Brenda Onken

Fall is definitely here! I love the cooler temperatures and the beautiful colors that appear from the turning leaves. On my search for migrating warblers, I was also noticing the butterflies that were attracted to the tall prairie plants and goldenrods. The Monarchs were present in large numbers. After all, they were on migration too.

Turning my mind back to the warblers, I entered the woods. There I began to observe a busy Red-bellied Woodpecker, flying back and forth. It landed on a dead tree, where, through my binoculars, I noticed it stuffing an acorn into a hole. Off it would fly, then return with another acorn. Tap, tap, tap... it would stuff the acorn in, making sure that it was there to stay.

When I returned home, I pulled out my copy of The Birder's Handbook to find out about this behavior. I learned that Red-bellies hoard nuts, fruits, seeds and acorns. All make up part of their diet.

This particular bird was a female and she was busy. Most people are familiar with the Red-bellied Woodpecker. They frequently visit feeders to eat suet and black oil sunflower. The nape of the neck on the female is red, while the male sports a red nape and crown. They get their name from the tinge of red that adorns their bellies. They construct nests in dead wood by excavating a hole.

To encourage these birds and others to visit you this winter, order your seed from Peoria Audubon today. Your purchases will directly support the Peoria Audubon Society. It will also help keep your yard busy with bird activity. So order early and by lots! To borrow a phrase from Dr. Princen, "The birds will love you!"
