Peoria Audubon to Establish Peoria Lakes Bird Census...

In order to establish critical baseline data of the Upper and Lower Peoria Lake's bird populations, Peoria Audubon will be conducting a weekly year-round census from 8 points along the Illinois River roughly from the Peoria Lock and Dam, north to near Chillicothe. This data is crucial in understanding local bird populations, and tracking the plight of bird species in light of several Illinois River projects that will be implemented over the next few years.
