Conservation

Featured Speaker: Joan Garland, Director of Education International Crane Foundation

The ICF works worldwide to conserve cranes and their wetland and grassland habitat.

They strive to alert scientists, government officials, and the public to the dependence of cranes on their habitats, and the causes and remedies for habitat destruction.

ICF maintains a collection of captive cranes at their 225-acre site near Baraboo, Wisconsin, allowing them to pursue two vital techniques for crane preservation: captive breeding and reintroduction into the wild. The site is open to the public. Visitors can see all 15 crane species, and can explore nature trails through oak savanna, wetlands and tall grass prairie - inhabited by many native bird species.

Thank you for your time and your volunteer service. Your comments are welcome.


